





Results of Tourism Activity 2019

Undersecretariat of Planning and Tourism Policy

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During 2019:

- 1. International tourists arrivals was 45.0 million, higher by 3.7 million than 2018 same period, increasing 9.0%.
- 2. Foreign currency income for international travelers amounted to 24 thousand and 563 million dollars, which represented an increase of 9.0% over the January-December 2018 period.
- 3. The amount of foreign currency spent by travelers residing in Mexico when going abroad was 9 thousand and 848 million dollars, a lower amount of one thousand 382 million dollars than observed in January-December 2018 and equivalent to a reduction of (-)12.3%.
- 4. International tourists departures from Mexico abroad amounted to 19 million 547 thousand tourists, 201 thousand 718 tourists less than January-December 2018 period, wich represented (-) 1.0% decrese.
- 5. International travelers balance registered a surplus of 14 thousand and 715 million dollars, 30.3% higher than observed in January-December 2018 period.
- 6. United States citizens's arrivals by air stands out, representing 55.2% of the total amount, while Canada was 12.1%. Colombia and Brazil citizens participated with 3.2% and 2% of total, respectively. European region had a 12.4% share in total, 3.1% corresponding to United Kingdom citizens, same period.
- 7. Hotel occupancy percentage in the grouping of 70 tourist centers was 60.3%, lower level by (-) 0.7 percentage points compared to observed in January-December of the last year when it was 61.0%.
- 8. Domestic tourist arrivals to hotel rooms reached 62 million 82 thousand tourists (73.0% of total); while 22 million 920 thousand were international tourists (27.0% of the total).






ARRIVAL OF INTERNATIONAL VISITORS










AVERAGE EXPENDITURE OF LONG-STAY TOURISTS, AIR TRANSPORT






DEPARTURES OF INTERNATIONAL TOURIST FROM MEXICO







INTERNATIONAL VISITORS TO MEXICO ARRIVING BY AIR

Chart 8. During January-December 2019 United States citizens's arrivals by air stands out, representing 55.2% of total, from Canada was 12.1%, while the European region had 12.4% participation in total, corresponding 3.1% to United Kingdom citizens, South America region represented 11.8% of total, Colombia and Brazil citizens participated with 3.2% and 2.1% of total, in same period.








INTERNATIONAL VISITORS TO MEXICO ARRIVING BY AIR (MAIN COUNTRIES BY RESIDENCE)






AMERICAN PASSENGERS PER AIRPORT



























VISITORS TO MUSEUMS AND ARCHEOLOGICAL SITES






TOURISM EMPLOYMENT

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ECONOMIC CONTEXT

International

During the fourth quarter of 2019, the world economy continued to show a lower than expected growth rate, in a context characterized by commercial tensions - although well attenuated in relation to the first half of the year - a deterioration of industrial production in most of the main economies and lower investment flows, as well as greater political uncertainty globally. In this context, during the last quarter of 2019, synchrony continued in the deceleration of advanced and emerging economies, although economic activity in the United States showed resilience and progress were made in the negotiations to reach agreements in trade disputes.

The expectation of a less adverse commercial environment was reflected in an increase in the prices of various raw materials, such as gold, food and oil, as well as lower volatility and risk aversion in international financial markets. In addition, in the quarter covered by this report, there was a general appreciation in the exchange rates of the main emerging and advanced economies with respect to the US dollar.

In line with the process of deceleration in global economic activity coupled with internal factors, economic activity in Mexico has shown a slowdown in its growth rate.

National

In the third quarter of 2019, the GDP registered a decrease in real terms of 0.3% in its annual comparison, while, when eliminating the seasonal effect, there was no real variation with respect to the previous quarter.

By sector of economic activity, the contraction in the growth of economic activity contributed mainly to the contraction in the construction sector and the weakening in the growth of the services sector. In particular, within the services sector, the greatest contraction was observed in wholesale trade, accommodation and food and beverage preparation showed a contraction in the third quarter.

Regarding the components of domestic aggregate demand in the third quarter of 2019, the slowdown was mainly reflected in a contraction in private investment and public consumption. On the other hand, public investment showed a marginal increase and private consumption maintained a growth, similar to the previous quarter. Likewise, the trade balance registered a historically high trade surplus, the result of an expansion in exports coupled with a decrease in imports.

Considering the timely estimate for the fourth quarter of 2019, the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) showed zero growth compared to the third quarter (with seasonally adjusted data) and a contraction of 0.3% in annual variation. Based on timely information, GDP is estimated to record a real annual contraction in 2019 of 0.1%. On the other hand, tertiary activities showed a positive quarterly growth of 0.3%, while the agricultural sector and industrial production showed a contraction of 0.9 and 1.0% respectively. Given these estimates, the actual annual variations in 2019 for the primary, secondary and tertiary sectors are expected to be 1.9, - 1.7 and 0.5%, respectively.
