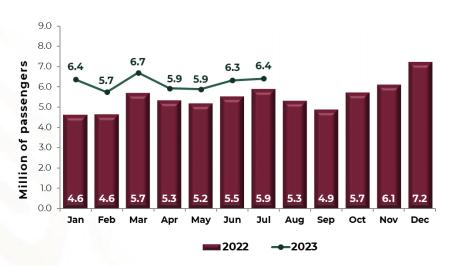

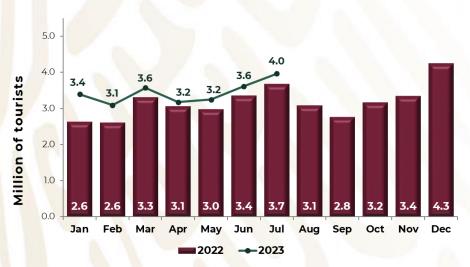

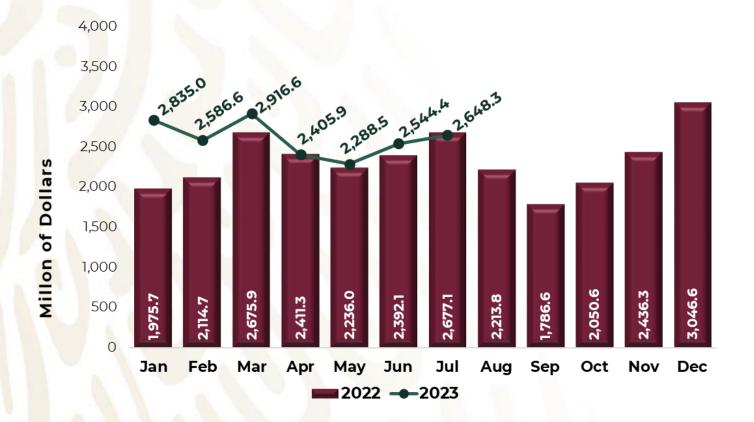




Foreign Exchange Revenue From International Visitors

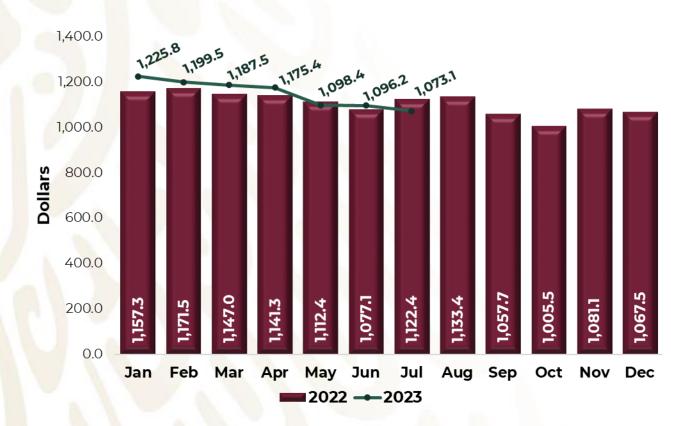




Average Expenditure of Long-Stay Tourists, Air Transport

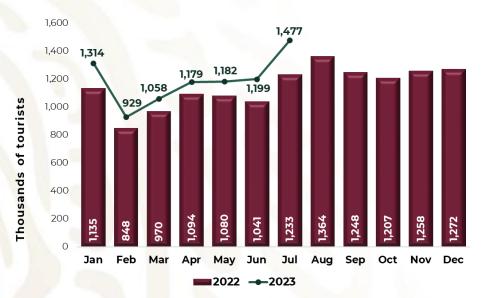








Departures Of International Tourists From Mexico

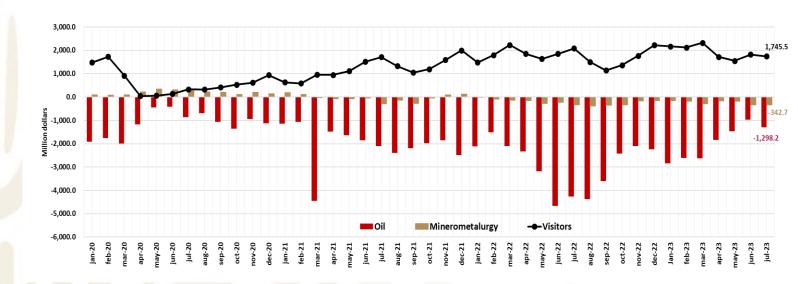

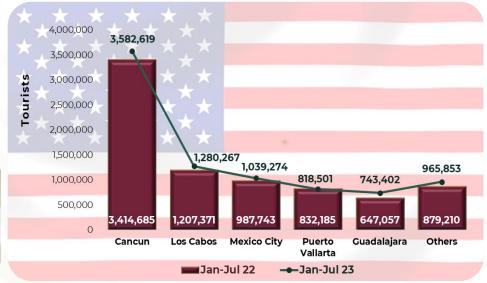

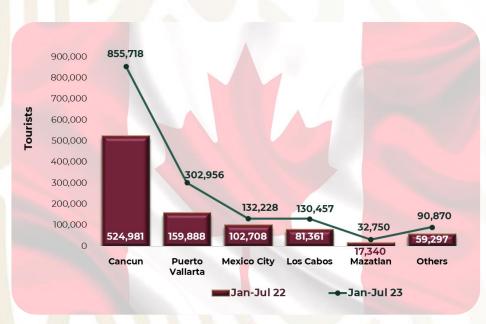

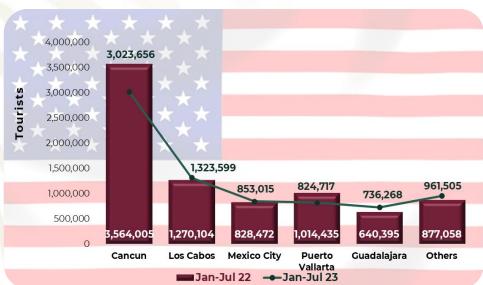


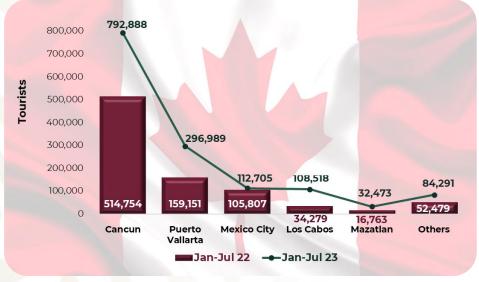

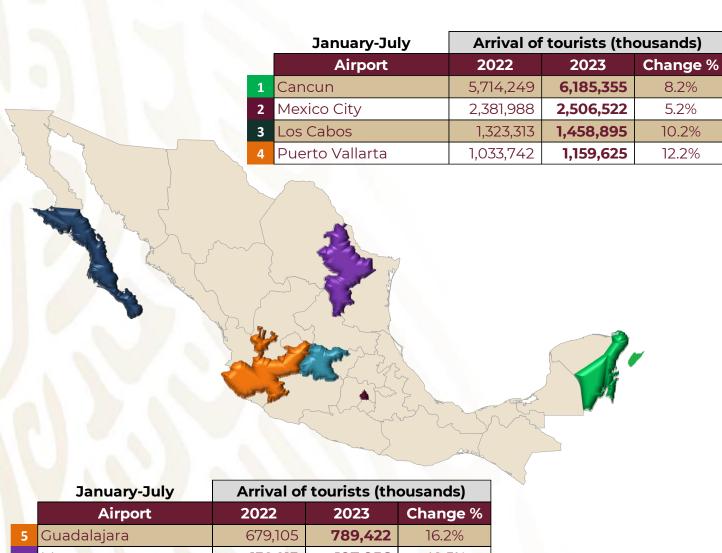

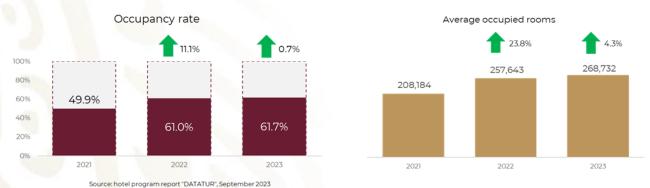

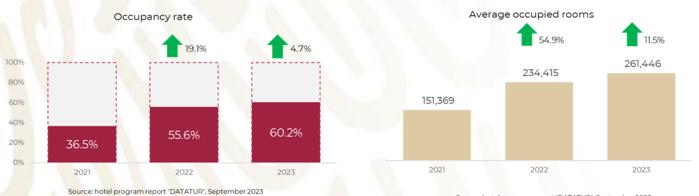

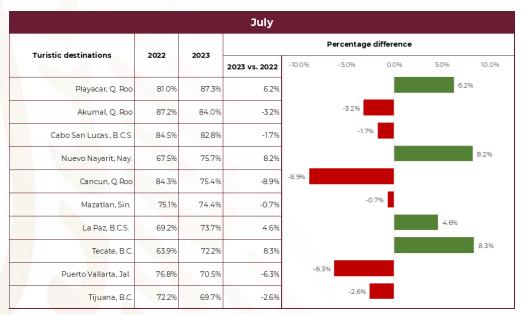






Occupancy Percentage Ranking

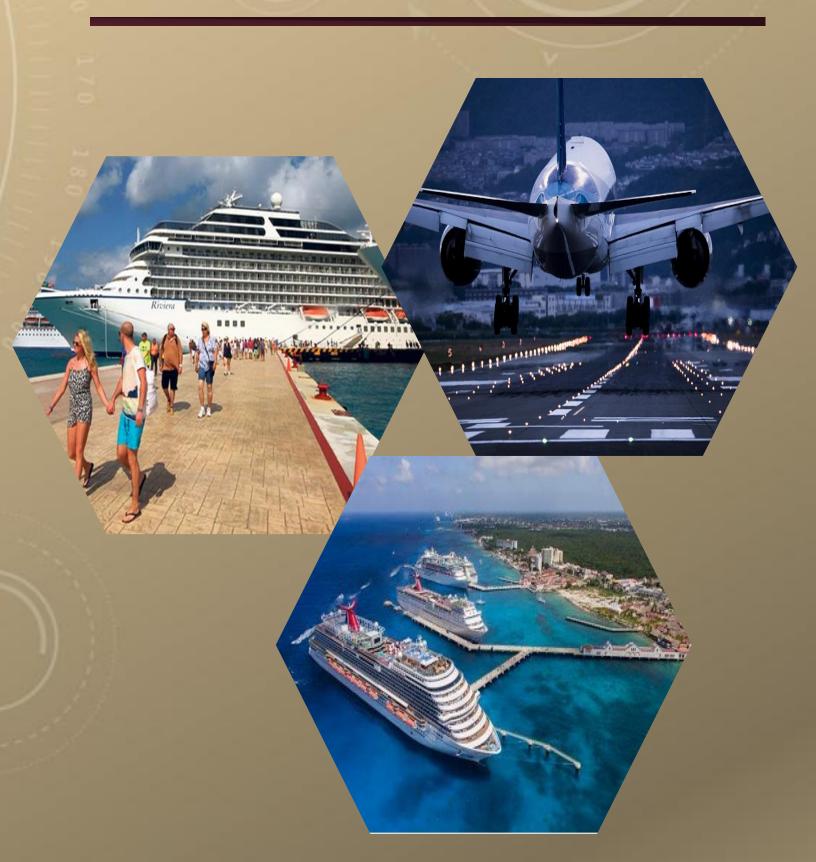

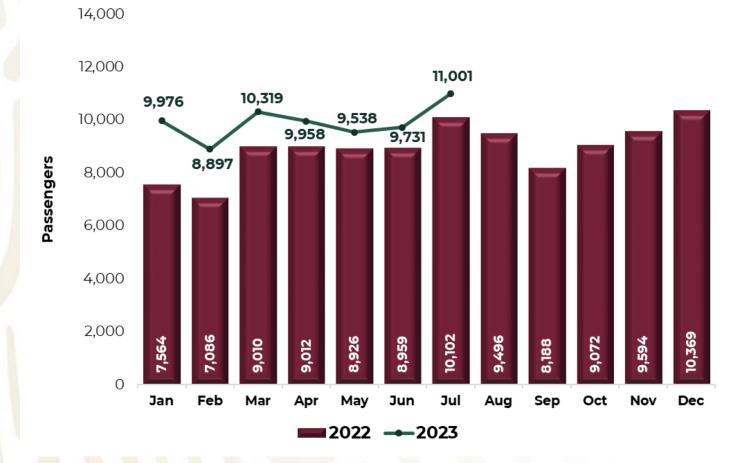




Total Passengers Transported on Domestic And International Flights

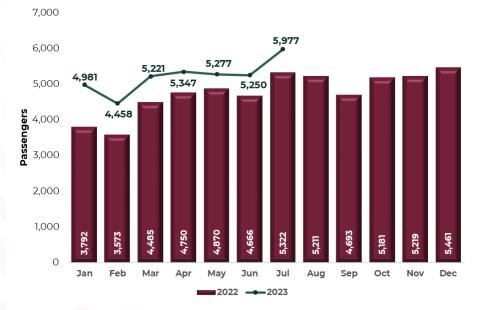

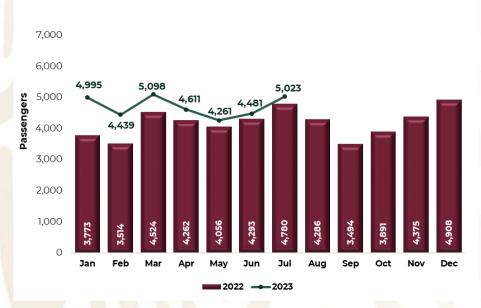

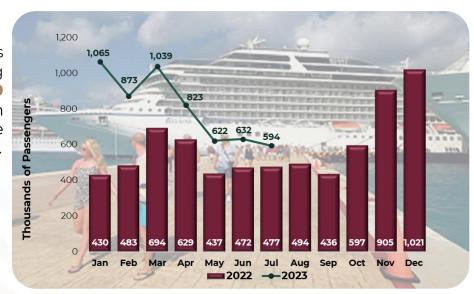

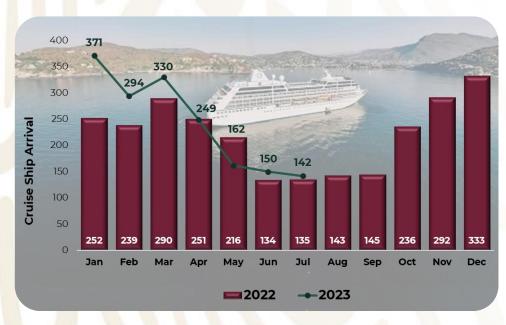

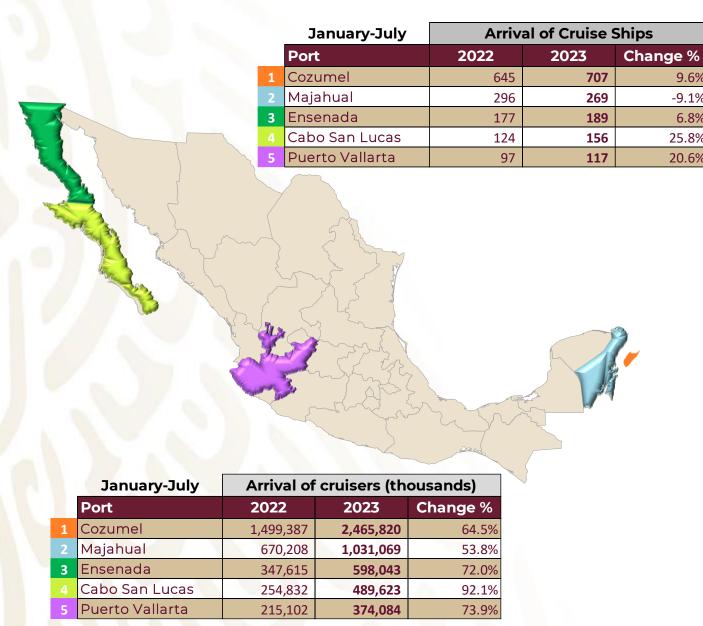

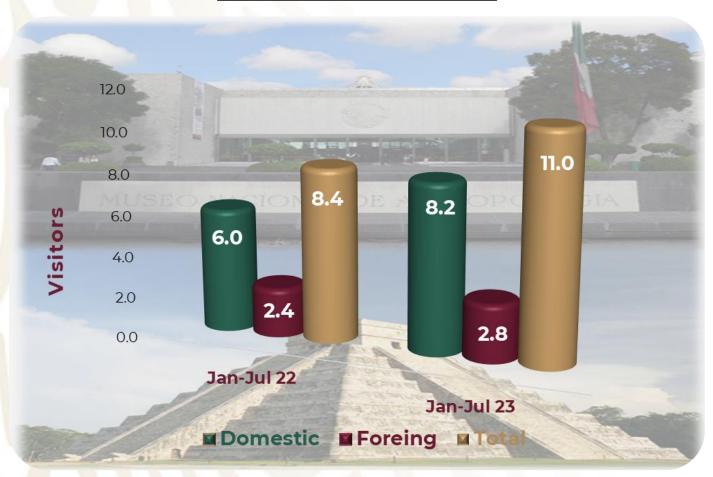




Visitors to Museums and Archeological Sites

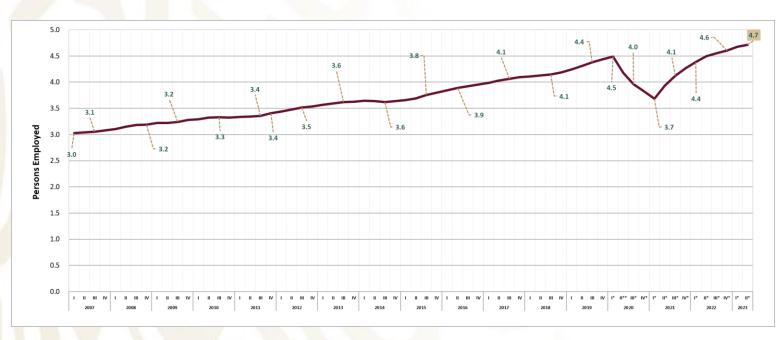




Tourist Employment Second Quarter 0f 2023

- The population employed in the tourism sector in Mexico amounted to 4 million 713 thousand direct jobs in the second quarter of 2023 and represented 8.9% of the national employment; equivalent to an increase of +4.8% over the same period in 2022.
- With this result, an increase of 216,008 direct jobs was observed in the sector producing tourism goods and services.

Economic Context (Ministry of Finance)

National

In the first half of 2023, economic activity grew 1.6% over the previous semester, bringing the GDP level to 2.3% above the level of the third quarter of 2022, reaching a new historical peak. This positive result was mainly due to the strength of the domestic market where consumption, investment and employment were the most important factors explaining its dynamism. Also noteworthy is the real wage growth, combined with lower inflationary pressures, increased credit to households and increased consumer confidence.

Increased investment in the country also contributed to economic growth during the first half of 2023. Investments in machinery and equipment were positioned as the most dynamic item, as well as investment in non-residential construction, which together with public infrastructure will be important factors for medium-term growth. These results are given in a context where the producer confidence indicator reached a maximum level in the July and August average since it was registered and, Indicators of the right time to invest have continued to rise above their pre-pandemic trend, a situation that began in mid-2021.

In addition, there has been an increase in optimism about the benefits of relocating production processes in Mexico through foreign direct investment flows in sectors and regions of the country where there is a high comparative advantage, as well as the greater logistical facilities that have favored global trade. In this context, in the first half of the year, the external sector contributed about 40% of the total economic growth through the flow of remittances and manufacturing and agricultural exports, while the latter recorded record levels. Also, tourism revenues accumulated in the first half of the year an annual growth of 12.8% with the respective benefit for related national economic activities.

International

In the first half of 2023, global economic activity continued to grow faster than expected at the beginning of the year, although more moderate in the second quarter than in the first. In turn, the divergence in economic growth was most evident between major economies and economic sectors. In the case of the US, economic activity maintained strong growth in the first two quarters of the year, driven by strong domestic demand and positive labour market outcomes. Meanwhile, several indicators pointed to a greater dynamism in the service sector, as opposed to manufacturing with more moderate growth rates that are expected to spread over the rest of the year.

In contrast, in the euro area and China, economic performance was less dynamic. In the first case, after the stagnation of economic activity in the first three months of the year, higher growth was registered in the second quarter, although below that observed the previous year and affected by the fall in industrial production. In the case of the Chinese economy, its growth rate slowed in the second quarter compared to the previous one, despite the economic reopening after the pandemic at the beginning of the year. This lower dynamism came from the real estate sector and weak external demand; both factors are expected to continue contributing negatively to growth towards the end of 2023.

Likewise, global inflationary pressures decreased due to the normalization of supply chains, decreases in raw material prices, the containment of demand factors and the anchoring of expectations by monetary policy. However, a risk for the rest of the year will continue to be food and energy prices due to climatological factors, such as droughts in South America and geopolitical conflicts. In particular, the price of energy products such as oil will continue to be influenced by the production cuts announced by OPEC+.
