




Arrival Of International Visitors to Mexico








Foreign Exchange Revenue From International Visitors






Average Expenditure of Long-Stay Tourists, Air Transport































Occupancy Percentage Ranking








Total Passengers Transported on Domestic And International Flights










Visitors to Museums and Archeological Sites




TOURIST GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

Economic Context (Ministry of Finance)

National

In this context, in Mexico, during the third quarter of the year, economic activity continued to grow, driven by the remarkable performance of the labor market and the decrease in inflation, as well as higher levels of producer and consumer confidence. In addition, he highlighted the growth of gross fixed investment, an indicator that reached a historic peak in July, due to the high demand of the private sector in non-residential construction. The external sector also had a positive contribution to growth, derived from the behavior of items such as automotive exports, remittance flows and tourism.

With the most recent information from the second quarter, private consumption registered an increase of 1.0% quarterly, with figures adjusted for seasonality, favored by the increase in real wages, the decline in inflation and the appreciation of the peso against the US dollar. This last factor actively contributed to the consumption of imported goods increasing by 5.8% quarterly, the highest growth for the period from April to June since 2002. Also, between July and September consumption in self-service and departmental stores linked ten consecutive quarterly increases driven mainly by the increased demand for essential goods.

As for the external sector, it maintained a positive contribution to the growth of economic activity in Mexico, despite the lower dynamism observed in world trade. Between July and September, a 2.3% quarterly increase in the value of non-oil exports was observed, with seasonally adjusted figures, driven by the automotive component. In addition, in the same period, there was an increase of 5.7% in the value of imports of non-oil consumer goods. It should be noted that, in the period of analysis, Mexico consolidated as the main trading partner of the USA

International

During the third quarter of 2023, global economic activity registered a higher rate of growth than observed the previous quarter, despite restrictive financial conditions, persistent inflationary pressures, rising energy prices and geopolitical conflicts. This dynamism in the economy came from the strength of domestic demand and the strength of the labour market.

In addition, reduced supply constraints allowed for greater supply of inputs and trade resulting from standardization in global supply chains. However, global trade showed moderation in growth, mainly due to lower activity in Europe.

In addition, divergences from the rate of growth of the world's major economies continued. In the US, according to preliminary information, real GDP registered a quarterly growth of 1.2% supported by the strength of private consumption, which contributed more than half to the growth of the quarter, in line with strong job creation and investment-oriented fiscal stimuli. In China, growth in the third quarter accelerated at a rate of 1.3% from the 0.5% observed the previous quarter, driven by an accommodative monetary policy and an expansive fiscal policy, although the weakness in the real estate sector continued. Meanwhile, the stagnation of industrial production and the slowdown in the volume of exports pointed to almost zero economic growth in the euro area by the third quarter, according to the latest available figures.
