




Arrival Of International Visitors to Mexico








Foreign Exchange Revenue From International Visitors






Average Expenditure of Long-Stay Tourists, Air Transport



























Occupancy Percentage Ranking














Visitors to Museums and Archeological Sites

National Tourist Price Index (NTPI) October 2023

The National Tourist Price Index is an economic indicator that monitors price fluctuations in representative tourist services in Mexico. Helps travelers, businesses and policymakers understand price trends in the tourism industry and impact on the national economy

The NTPI registered an increase from 130.81 in September to 134.03 in October 2023

The NTPI consists of six key components selected for their economic importance and representativeness in tourism consumption, which recorded the following annual inflation:



Air transportation +22.21%



Highway tolls +9.44%



Restaurants, bars and the like +8.99%



Package tour services +7.18%



Hotels +7.16%



Foreign bus +4.49%









FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT IN TOURISM

During January to September 2023 Foreign Direct Investment in Tourism (FDIT) registered 2,276.6 million dollars, equivalent to 6.9% of the National Foreign Direct Investment.

The Foreign Direct Investment in Tourism registered in the third quarter of 2023, amounts to 504.2 million US dollars, equivalent to 27.1% of the Foreign Direct Investment collected in the country.

FDIT PARTICIPATION BY TYPE OF ECONOMIC ACTIVITY

In the third quarter of 2023, Foreign Direct Tourism Investment stands out in:

- Apartments and houses furnished with hotel services (98.8%)
- Administration of airports and helipads (1.1%)
- Together these classes represent 99.9% of the total FDIT in that period.

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




Tourist Employment Third Quarter 0f 2023

- The population employed in the tourism sector in Mexico amounted to 4 million 764 thousand direct jobs in the third quarter of 2023 and represented 9.0% of the national employment.
- With this result, an increase of 211,921 direct jobs was observed in the sector producing tourism goods and services, equivalent to an increase of +4.7% over the same period in 2022.

Economic Context (Ministry of Finance)

National

According to timely information on the performance of the national GDP in the third quarter of 2023, economic activity showed greater dynamism than expected, showing that the pace of growth remains robust.

As regards domestic demand, investment has maintained high growth rates, even at a faster rate than overall economic activity, characterized mainly by the contribution of non-residential construction, although the investment in machinery and equipment has also had an impact.

The expectations generated by the phenomenon of relocation are driving investment in general and construction in particular.

The labour market continues to show strengths, where unemployment rates remain at historically low levels and IMSS-affiliated jobs continued to increase gradually.

Annual wage growth continues to be high, particularly for insured IMSS workers who have experienced double-digit annual variations. When considering the evolution of wages in the National Survey of Occupation and Employment (ENOE), these seem to respond with some lag to the dynamics of inflation, so that a process of wage adjustment could still be observed as a result of the previously observed high levels of inflation.

International

In the third quarter of the year, global economic activity continued to expand at a faster rate than in the second quarter, where there is a heterogeneity in economic growth between different countries, highlighting the resilience of the US economy.

Thus, the prospects for the growth of the world economy by international organizations remained unchanged, although for the United States they were revised upwards for 2023 and 2024.

Overall inflation continued to decline in most economies. However, he specified that in a large number of these it still remains above central bank targets, most of which have kept their reference rates unchanged.

As regards general inflation, it showed a certain upturn, partly because of the behaviour of energy prices, despite the fact that various price pressures have been mitigated as the effects of the shocks resulting from the pandemic and the war in Ukraine have been dissipated.

Overall, inflation is expected to converge with central bank targets by the end of 2024 or by 2025.

The geopolitical conflict in the Middle East could have repercussions on the global inflationary landscape, but so far its effects have been limited.

At its November meeting, the Federal Reserve maintained unchanged the target range for the federal funds rate, a decision that represents the second consecutive pause. In fact, the president of the Federal Reserve highlighted the likelihood that tighter financial and credit conditions will have an impact on economic activity, the labor market and inflation.
