International visitors

Chart 1. According to Bank of Mexico, the arrival of international visitors in January-April of 2016 was 31.7 millions, representing an increase of 2.8 millions compared to the same period of 2015*, with a growth of 9.7%.



International tourists

Chart 2. The number of international tourists arriving to Mexico during January-April of 2016 was 11.4 millions, reaching one million more than January-April 2015, an increase of 9.9%.





Chart 2. Monthly Arrival of International Tourists



Foreign Currency Income by International visitors

Chart 3. Foreign currency inflows from the arrival of international visitors was 6,778 million dollars in January-April 2016, reaching an increase of 435 million dollars (6.9%) in comparison to the same period last year.



Tourism Balance by International visitors

Chart 4. The tourism balance by international visitors in January-April of 2016 registered 3,739 million dollars, an increase of 16.1% in comparison to the same period of 2015.




Chart 4. Monthly Result of Tourism Balance from



Foreign Currency Income by International tourists

Chart 5. Foreign currency income from international tourists in January-April of 2016 registered 6,084 million dollars, which represents an increase of 415 million dollars (7.3%) to the same period of 2015.



Tourism Balance by International tourists

Chart 6. The tourism balance by international tourists in January-April of 2016 showed a surplus of 4,053 million dollars, equivalent to an increase of 13.4% in comparison to the same period of 2015.



Average Expenditure by International tourists

Chart 7. During January-April of 2016, the average expenditure of international tourists was 531.7 dollars, a decrease of 12.6 dollars (-2.3%) in comparison to the same period 2015. This behavior may be explained by the appreciation of the dollar against the peso, which means that a dollar can buy more tourism goods and services in the visited destinations, with respect to that obtained in the same period last year.

Long-Stay tourists to Mexico

Chart 8. The long-stay tourists arrival increased 13.9% in the four-month period of 2016 compared to the same period of the previous year: about 87.2% entered by air while the remaining 12.8% entered by land.





Chart 8. Transport of International Long-Stay Tourists



Chart 10. The average expenditure of long-stay tourists was 846.3 dollars in the first four months of 2016, a decrease of 47.3 dollars (-5.3%) compared to the same period of 2015.

Border tourists to México

Chart 11. The border tourists arrivals increased 4.3% during January-April of 2016 compared to the same period last year, a fact which is explained in part by the appreciation of the dollar relative to the peso; 83.7% entered by automobile while the remaining 16.3% were pedestrians^{*}.




Chart 11. Transport of International Border Tourists

Chart 12. Distribution of International Border Tourists' Expense during January-April 2016




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Average Expenditure of Border tourists

Chart 13. The average expenditure of border tourists decreased 4.3% in January-April of 2016 in comparison to the same month of previous year, derived from the appreciation of the dollar against the peso.



Foreign Visitors by air (main countries of residence)

Chart 14. In January-April of 2016, the arrival of foreign aircoming visitors who reside in the United States, accounted for 57.7% of all foreign arrivals by air.

From Latin America and the Caribbean. the country of residence with the highest number of foreign arrivals into México was Argentina with 137,599 which visitors. represents increase an of 36.7%.




Chart 14. Participation of Foreign Visitors by Air and

Foreign passengers arriving by Air (American)

Chart 15. The American residents who arrived by air to Mexico increased 14.7% in January-April of 2016 in comparison to the same period of 2015, accumulating 3.3 million passengers who arrived mainly by Cancun Airport, followed by Los Cabos Airport.




Chart 15. American Residents per Airport

Chart 16. The Canadian residents who arrived by air to México were 0.3% lower during January-April of 2016 in comparison with the same period of 2015, accumulating 933,202 passengers who arrived mainly by Cancun Airport, followed by Puerto Vallarta Airport.




Chart 16. Canadian Residents per Airport


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Percentage of Hotel Occupation

Chart 17. The percentage of hotel occupation of a group of 70 resorts in the four-month period of 2016 was 61.7%, 1.1 percentage points higher in comparison to the same period last year.



Arrival of tourists to Hotels

Chart 18. During January-April of 2016, the arrival of domestic tourists to hotel rooms was over 17.2 million tourists (74.3%), the remaining arrivals (25.7%) correspond to foreign tourists.




Chart 18. Arrivals of tourist to hotel rooms

Chart 19. The number of passengers arriving by air during January-April of 2016 was 19.6 million passengers, representing one million 913 thousand passengers additional (10.8%) in comparison to the same period last year.





Figure 1. In January-April 2016 the airports with the highest number of foreign passengers were: Cancún (2,606,045), Ciudad de México (1,071,687), Puerto Vallarta (609,225), Los Cabos (529,599) and Guadalajara (251,856); which represents 89.7% of all foreign passengers.

Chart 23. During January-April of 2016, the number of cruise passengers was 2.5 million; similar level in comparison to the same period of last year.





Chart 23. Monthly Arrival of Passengers by Cruise








Main ports

Figure 2. In January-April of 2016 the ports that received the highest number of passengers were the following: Cozumel, Majahual and Ensenada; representing 76.3% of total arrivals in the four months. On the other hand, according to Banco de México, foreign currency income from cruise visitors contributed with 2.6% of the total income.

Macroeconomic Indicators

- The International Monetary Fund (IMF) in its publication "Perspectives of the World Economy" released last April 2016 considered that the global economy maintains a slow and fragile recovery.
- For 2016, the Ministry of Finance of México in its General Pre-criteria Policy economic anticipates a GDP growth for Mexico at a range of 2.6% and 3.0%, respectively.
- In the first quarter of 2016, Mexican GDP grew 2.6% in annual terms, and it is expected that the dynamism of tourism GDP exceeds the national GDP, as observed in the last quarters of 2015.
- In the 1Q16, the GDP components associated with tourist services such as air transport, services of temporary lodging and preparation of foods and beverages, registered annual growth rates of 17.4 %, 6.8% and 6.8%, respectively.
- At the same time, inflation trajectory remains stable in April 2016 at 2.54% in annual terms. In addition, the CPI components associated with tourism services such as air transportation, lodging, travel package services and restaurants maintained a stable trajectory.
