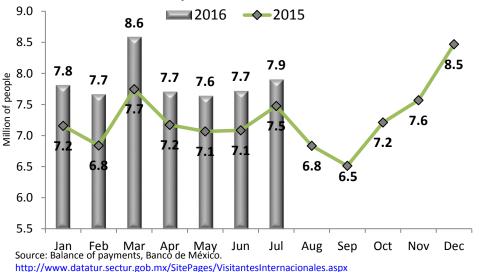




International visitors

Chart 1. Bank of Mexico reported that the arrival of international travelers during the January-July period of 2016 was 55.0 million, which represents an increase of 8.9 %. In July 2016, 7.9 million travelers arrived, 5.7% more than the number registered in the same month last year (7.5 million travelers). This is the highest level for July since 2010.

Chart 1. Monthly Arrival of International Visitors



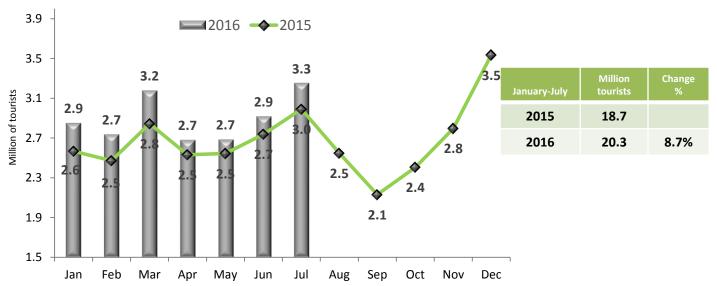

Chart 2. The arrival of international tourists during January-July of 2016 was 20.3 million, an increase of 8.7 %. In July 2016, international tourists arrivals reached 3,251 thousands, which represents an annual increase of 8.8%. This is the highest number for July since 2010.

Chart 3. The income of foreign exchange from international visitors during January-July of 2016 was 11,879 million, an increase of 976 million dollars compared to January-July of 2015, an increase of 9.0%. The figure recorded by Banxico is the largest for the month of July since 2010.

Tourism Balance by International visitors

Chart 4. The balance of international visitors during January-July of 2016 recorded 6,260.4 million, an amount 19.2% above of the observed in the same period of 2015. The balance is composed of the foreign exchange earnings of international travelers minus total spending of national travelers abroad.

Average Expenditure of International tourists by air

Chart 5. The average monthly expenditure of international tourists by air was 940.7 dollars during January-July 2016, a reduction of 8.3 dollars (-0.9%) compared to January-July 2015. Among the factors explaining this evolution are: the appreciation of the dollar against the Mexican peso.

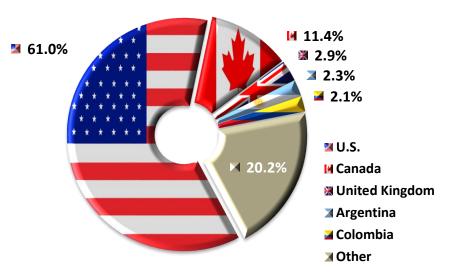

Foreign Visitors by air (main countries of residence)

Chart 6. In January-July of 2016, the arrival of foreign aircoming visitors who reside in the **United States**, accounted for **61.0%**.

From Latin America and the Caribbean, the country of residence with the highest number of foreign arrivals into México was **Argentina** with **2.3%** of total.

Foreign passengers arriving by Air (American)

Chart 7. American residents who arrived by air to Mexico increased 13.2% in January-July 2016 in comparison to the same period 2015, reaching 6 million passengers who arrived mainly by Cancun Airport, followed by Mexico City Airport.

Chart 7. American Residents per Airport



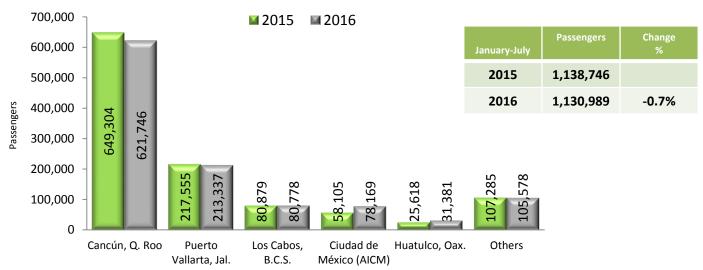

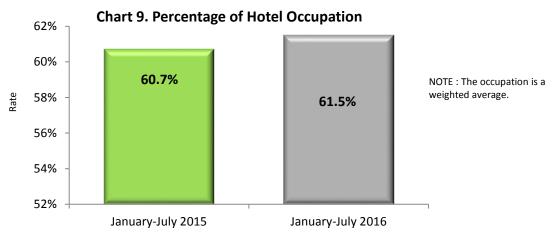

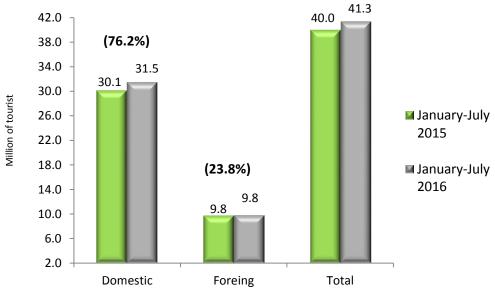

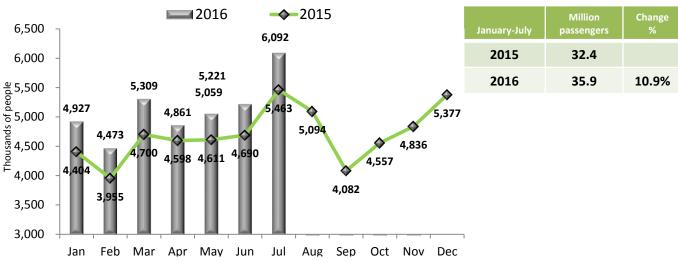




Air Transportation

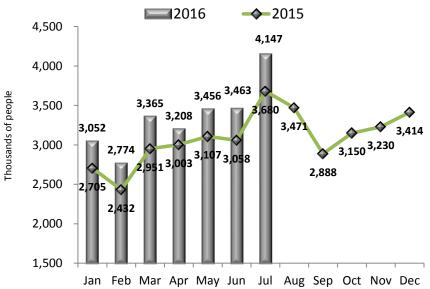
Chart 11. Total Passengers

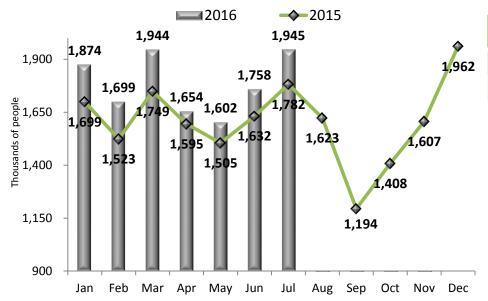

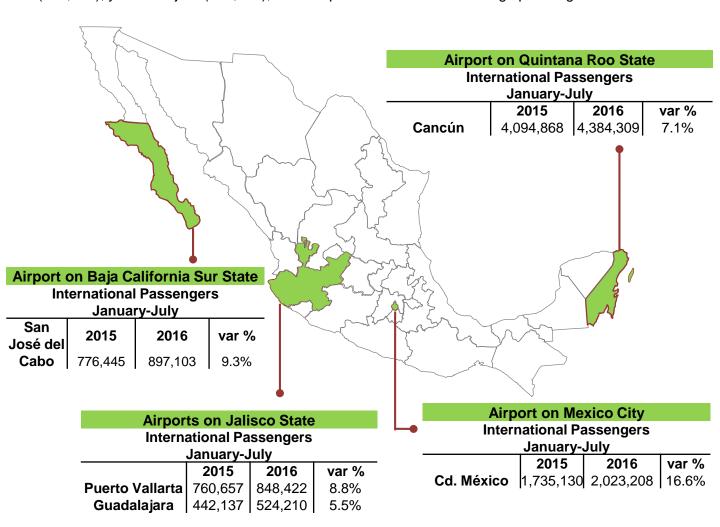

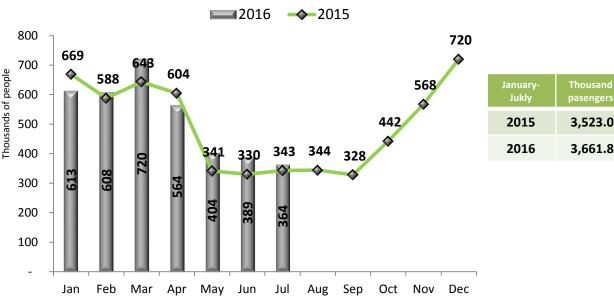

Chart 17. During January-July 2016, the number of cruise passengers was 3.7 million passengers; this is an increase of 3.9% in comparison to the same period of last year.

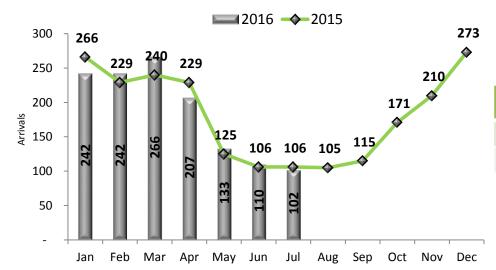
Chart 17. Monthly Arrival of Passengers by Cruise

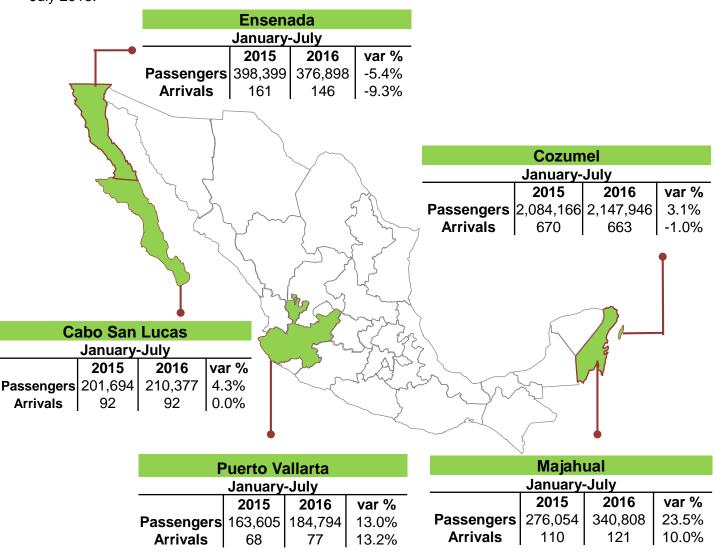

Macroeconomic Indicators

International

During 2016 the world economy will continue to grow at a moderate rate of 3.1%, very close to that observed in 2015 to observe a marginal recovery in 2017, according to information from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) level.

This behavior is differentiated between advanced and emerging economies considered:

- While advanced economies will moderate its growth rate to the expected lower growth of the economies of the US and the UK, as well as greater uncertainty in the euro area,
- In the case of emerging economies the start of a recovery is expected in 2016 over the previous year.

National

- However, the adverse international environment Mexico's economy maintained a positive performance in the first half of 2016, growing 2.5% over the period from January to June 2015, the highest growth for a first quarter since 2012.
- Some components of GDP related to tourism such as air transport services, temporary accommodation services and preparation of food and beverages recorded annual growth of 18.1%, 4.4% and 4.8% respectively in the first half of 2016.
- In July, overall inflation remained below the target of 3.0% of the central bank by 2.7%.
- Considering the monthly change in July 2016 on the CPI, prices of air transport fell 13.78%, with a negative monthly 0.038 percentage point impact on inflation in general; while prices of tourist services in package fell 9.03%, with a negative impact of 0.055 percentage points over the same period.
